ICC International Court of Arbitration

The International Court of Arbitration is the world's leading arbitral institution. Since 1923, we have administered over 28,000 cases resolving international commercial and business disputes. In 2023, we have celebrated our 100th anniversary, marking a century at the forefront of supporting global trade and investment through dispute prevention and resolution.

The Court provides parties with a flexible and neutral setting for dispute resolution. It offers confidentiality and extraordinary freedom for parties to choose the framework for how and where they want to resolve their dispute. While the dispute itself is resolved by independent arbitrators, the Court supervises the entire process from beginning to end, ensuring high-quality proceedings and enforceable awards.

Members of the ICC Court are appointed by the ICC World Council based on proposals from national committees and groups. For the 2024-2027 mandate, the Court comprises 191 members from 119 jurisdictions.

The Court's Secretariat, led by the Secretary General, comprises a permanent staff of 114 legal and administrative professionals from <u>35 different nationalities and speaking as many languages</u>,

The Secretariat is organised into case-management teams, with seven based in Paris, and the others located in Hong Kong, in New York, São Paulo, Singapore and Abu Dhabi.
